PREFACE

Global transformations in the field of education have reverberated across all domains across the world. Professor Shyam B. Following Menon's important recommendations, the government officials decided to implement the Four Year Undergraduate Program (FYUGP) across the state. The University of Kerala has meticulously prepared a draft curriculum framework and regulations for FUGP in conjunction with the recommendations of the Examination Reform Committee and the University Law Reform Committee constituted by the Government of Kerala. As part of this initiative, the Board of Studies conducted two orientation sessions and two workshops. As a result, syllabi suitable for various FYUGPs are currently being developed.

The FYUGP emphasizes a personalized learning experience, empowering students to shape their educational journey according to their interests and goals. Upon completion of 133 credits over three years, students will receive an Undergraduate Degree, while achieving 177 credits within four years will qualify them for either an Undergraduate Honours Degree or an Undergraduate Honours with Research Degree. These credits can be earned through a diverse range of course categories offered to students.

The syllabus for Sanskrit literature within the FYUGP framework has been devised here. The Sanskrit Literature stands out as one of the most illustrious in the realm of world literature, encompassing both Vedic and Classical Sanskrit compositions. Vedic Literature transcends mere mantras, encompassing a vast array of knowledge spanning science, arts, humanities, medicine, environment, mathematics, astronomy, astrology, history, and geography, showcasing its dynamic breadth. Similarly, classical Sanskrit literature serves as a repository of diverse genres, including epics, court poetry, drama, romance, fairytales, fables, grammars, civil and religious law, among others.

The objectives of the Undergraduate Programme in Sanskrit Special Sahitya are as follows:

Foster an appreciation for the earliest literature of the world among students.

Cultivate an interest in mastering the most ancient language of India among students.

Stimulate students to glean insights into Indian culture and tradition from Sanskrit Literature.

Introduce students to the interdisciplinary aspects of Sanskrit studies.

Examine Sanskrit literature through scientific and humanistic lenses.

Instill ethical and moral values by fostering a strong sense of appropriateness.

Cultivate language proficiency through conversational practice and language usage.

Integrate ICT tools into Sanskrit education for enhanced learning experiences.

Highlight the linguistic significance of the Sanskrit language
